## 1 The path of the Bandolers



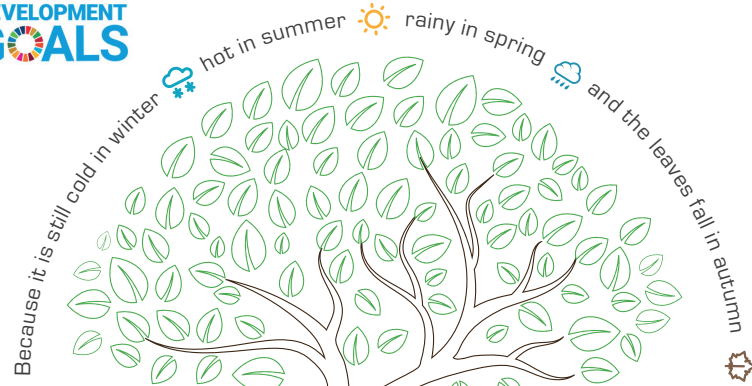
## 2 The path of Saint Valerià



Leave the church and follow the path of the Bandolers to the viewpoint (125m), from where you can see a large part of the Cordillera Prelitoral, Montseny, the cliffs of Bertí, El Farell and La Mola. We continue the route, choosing between two paths (A / B) until we reach the Caganell stream. An easy walk, the last stretch of which is made up of a spectacular plane grove and a riverside forest, where it is easy to see orioles, tallarols, jays, herons and nightingales.

We start the walk along the path behind the church of Gallecs and continue alongside the Caganell stream. We cross the central path of Gallecs, bordering the Torre de Malla, a splendid farmhouse documented as early as 904. We go round its hill and access the Saint Valerià path until we reach the Can Benito Pond. We return to the church square via the Caganell stream. The landscape is made up of extensive fields of cereals, including spelt.

## 4 Cycle route



We start the route along the path behind the church of Santa Maria de Gallecs, passing the leisure area of Can Mainou, crossing the Caganell stream towards the forest of Can Veire, Can Jaume Magre and the Diablons stream. From there to the Bache dels Oms Pond, the Can Salvi wetlands and back to the point of origin. In the stream, the riverside woods provide freshness in summer with plane trees, poplars, small-leaved ash trees and elms. In the wetlands of Can Salvi, you can see collverd ducks, green woodpeckers, kingfishers and even the occasional leper pond turtle.

This route initially passes through the Can Salvi banana grove and wetlands, the Caganell stream, the Can Torres Forest and the Saint Valerià path. It continues through Can Cònsul, passes in front of the Torre de Malla, and, through the Can Veire wood, returns to its starting point, the church of Santa Maria de Gallecs. Here begins the second part of the itinerary, which follows the path of the Bandolers, passes over the AP-7 motorway to the Pinetons, continues along Can Banús, the passera del passeig dels Castanyers, the pond of Can Benito and, once again passing by the Caganell stream, returns to the church.
